The **PSNA Star Leadership Institute**, in joint providership with Drexel University College of Nursing and Health Professions, is moving beyond educating healthcare providers through a single lens to creating a collaborative learning experience for all licensed members of the healthcare team. An expanding evidence base, complex patient care needs, and healthcare mergers and acquisitions emphasize the need for a thorough understanding of today's multifaceted systems and real-life problems. Inter-Professional Practice

Kymerlee Montgomery, DNP, CRNP-BC, CNE, FAANP • Associate Clinical Professor, Chair of NP Program, Drexel University

Team Building & Negotiation

Using Innovative Tools for Conversations About Serious Illness and End of Life Issues

Conversations about values and preferences are key to providing great end of life care. However, these conversations are far too rare. Jehlen, lead designer of the games *Hello* and *My Gift of Grace*, will share how games can help families, patients, caregivers, and clinicians have meaningful conversations while maintaining a safe and supportive environment.

Managing Information Technology

Success is influenced by effective management of information and technology. The role of governance in setting and achieving an organization's strategy is dependent on informed knowledge to guide planning and collaborative engagement. This session will discuss the evolving role and interrelatedness of information and technology in fueling healthcare leadership and information governance.

Measuring Healthcare Quality and Patient Safety

Quality measures in healthcare are defined by the value delivered across the care continuum to defined populations of patients. Healthcare leaders must understand quality from a population health perspective, including skills in systemwide collaboration, robust population management, and patient engagement at the point of service.
